## Background

Goat farming is a cornerstone of livestock production in many countries, playing a central role in food security, rural livelihoods, and climate resilience. Israel's experience in goat production offers a relevant and practical model for strengthening these systems through applied management, genetic improvement, and efficient use of limited resources.

In Israel, goat production is practiced under a wide range of systems, including intensive dairy operations, semi-intensive mixed systems, and extensive grazing-based systems. This diversity enables the transfer of adaptable knowledge to various production contexts, where environmental constraints, feed availability, and infrastructure limitations require flexible and realistic solutions.

## About the Course

The course provides a comprehensive and applied training program with a primary focus on goat production. Sheep production will be addressed only where relevant to mixed small-ruminant systems.

The main objective of the course is to support professionals in developing and strengthening goat production systems, improving productivity, resilience, and genetic potential while working within existing local resources. The course emphasizes practical and field-oriented decision making for flock management.

### The course emphasizes:

- Intensive, semi-intensive, and grazing-based goat systems
- Genetic improvement using realistic and accessible tools
- Adaptation of management practices rather than high-input solutions

## Main Subjects

The course will include discussions and field visits on:

- Overview of Goat Production Systems in Israel
- Intensive, Semi-Intensive, and Grazing-Based Goat Farming Models
- Applied Goat Breeding and Genetics under Resource Constraints
- Reproductive Management and Genetic Improvement Tools
- Nutrition Strategies Using Locally Available Feed Resources
- Kid Management, Colostrum Practices, and Early Growth
- Herd Health, Disease Prevention, and Biosecurity
- Dairy and Meat Goat Production
- Climate Adaptation and Sustainability
- Farm Economics and Value Chain Development
- Technology Transfer Adapted to Developing

## Pedagogical Approach

The course follows a “train-the-trainers” approach, enabling participants to return to their countries with the capacity to apply, adapt, and disseminate the knowledge acquired.

## General Information

### Arrival and Departure

Arrival date: 15<sup>th</sup> June 2026 (Hotel rooms available from 14:00)  
Official Opening date: 16<sup>th</sup> June, 2026  
Departure date: 26<sup>th</sup> June, 2026 (Check out until 11:00am)

Participants must arrive in Israel on the arrival date, and leave on the departure date. Early arrivals/late departures if required, must be fully coordinated in advance with the Embassy of Israel. Participants will have to cover any additional costs that may be incurred from early/late arrival/departure.

### Location and Accommodation

The training program will take place at - or near MATC - MASHAV's International Agricultural Training Center in Kibbutz Shefayim situated 20 km north of Tel Aviv and near the coastal city of Netanya. Participants will be accommodated in double rooms on a FB basis. (The specific hotel will be confirmed)

MASHAV awards a limited number of scholarships. The scholarship covers the cost of the training program including lectures and field visits, full board accommodation in double rooms, health insurance and transfers to and from the airport. Airfares and daily allowance are not included in the scholarship.

### Application Requirements

The course is geared towards professionals from governmental and non-governmental institutions, universities, research institutes and/or private sector, involved in the development of the small ruminants sector on a national, regional or local level.

Candidates should hold an academic degree in related disciplines and at least two years of professional experience. A full command of **English** is required.

### General Health Services:

1. **MASHAV'S Medical form/declaration** must be completed and submitted to the Embassy of Israel together with the application form.
2. Participants will be covered by a medical insurance contracted by MASHAV. The medical insurance coverage is for the exact duration of the training, and does not include additional days, in cases of early arrivals or late departures.

**MASHAV'S Medical insurance** covers only medical services and hospitalization in case of emergency. It does not cover the treatment of chronic or existing conditions, specific medications taken by the participant on a regular basis, dental care and eyeglasses. Participants will be responsible for all other expenses, which are not covered by the insurance policy.

Israeli health authorities recommend that all visitors to Israel make sure they **have been vaccinated against tetanus in the last ten years**.
